Al in Project Management: Sharing Best Practices that Earned Us a PMI Excellence Certificate of Appreciation

Background

Business intelligence has always captivated me, naturally leading to an interest in artificial intelligence. However, it wasn't until I read the **2019 PM Network article "Brain Power,"** about how machine learning could transform decision making in project management, that I felt AI was within reach. I decided to learn more to be ready when the right opportunity arose.


The right one arose at the end of 2021, when PMI Sweden President Katarina Strömberg supported my suggestion for a follow-up interview with two of the original article's subjects – **Geetha Gopal** and **Bruno Rafael Santos**. The <u>follow-up interview</u> discussed how the pandemic and digital disruption impacted AI interest and maturity. It marked the very beginning of this success story.

What has followed since is extraordinary: A global project involving 25 countries, 27 PMI Chapters, 34 project managers, and more than 2,300 survey respondents from 129 countries. Equally important was the support from thought leaders, influencers in AI in project management, academics, and AI experts worldwide.

I share this story to hopefully inspire others to pursue their own dreams and passions. As one of my role models, IKEA founder Ingvar Kamprad, said, "Most things remain undone – glorious future." There is still so much to do, especially surrounding AI, so dream big and aim high!

Project Organization and Process: PoC (Proof of Concept) Initiation, Planning, and Execution of Global Survey

Below are some of what I believe were our key success factors and challenges with a project this large.

Key Success Factors

- **Strong Sponsorship of Project:** Secure a strong sponsor or advocate to support decision-making when needed.
- **Solid Project Proposal**: Passion is contagious, but nothing beats facts when you need a GO decision. Back up your great idea with a comprehensive case (SWOT analysis, Project/Business Canvas, goals, scope, and objectives) for why the project should be undertaken, how it will be executed, and what benefits it is expected to deliver.
- **Proof of Concept The Gateway to Trust**: Start small to prove your case and adjust where needed. The AI in Project Management initiative began with a survey in May 2022, focusing on AI interest and maturity in Sweden. An <u>excellent report delivered in October 2022</u> built confidence and trust in the project's viability.
- **Involve Experts Early and Test Thoroughly**: We involved AI experts early on to ensure the questions were clear, met objectives and overall goals. We also consulted research experts for advice on the questionnaire, data cleaning, and analysis.
- Seek Engagement and Support from the Community: The engagement and support from the PM community and AI specialists was phenomenal. Thought leaders generously shared their visions of AI in project management, and AI specialists provided case studies and practical examples. The PM community, with over 2,300 respondents, offered invaluable insights through their participation in our survey.
- Emphasize Acknowledgment of Contribution: Proper recognition was given to all contributors. Team members were presented on the PMI Sweden website with photos, flags, and chapter logotypes. They were also included in the reports with their roles. PMI recognized the team's excellent work, and PMI Sweden rewarded all team members with digital badges.
- **Be Transparent to Build Confidence**: Transparency was a cornerstone throughout the project. During the survey period, we were open about the ongoing results, sharing preliminary insights and addressing any underhand information promptly. This openness included detailed descriptions of our processes, including data cleaning and the critical quality review conducted both internally by PMI and external experts.
- Delegate Set a Strategy and Let the Team Plan Their Work: The project lead set the
 overall strategy for the content and structure of the report and specified what each
 team should include to ensure conformity. The survey collection was managed by each
 chapter's project manager together with their volunteer network, allowing them to plan
 and execute their work independently.

• Marketing is Key: Early in the project, we formed a marketing team to share good examples of information in newsletters, avoiding reinventing the wheel. The team was very resourceful in marketing the project, producing reels, and so forth. Several articles were written, webinars recorded, and presentations delivered at conferences and congresses, giving the project recognition in the community. A LinkedIn group initiated within the project now has more than 1,400 members, showing the huge interest in Al.

Challenges

- **Time Zones:** Organizing meetings across nine different time zones was a logistical challenge, but the team's dedication made it possible.
- All-Volunteer Team: Running a team of volunteers with daytime jobs, family, and friends
 was another challenge. Fortunately, most of the team was extremely dedicated, and the
 way we were organized allowed people to plan their time and work independently.
- Communication: Although everyone was onboarded properly and informed about objectives and goals, having a SharePoint for better information structure would have been beneficial, as WhatsApp and other tools are better suited for quick information sharing.

I hope this story inspires you to pursue your own dream projects. Remember to dream big, aim high, and follow through with solid planning and execution. Looking ahead, the integration of AI in project management holds tremendous potential, and there is much more to explore and achieve.
